REPORTS OF COMMITTEE CHAIRS AND PROFESSIONALS

<u>Councilmember Impellizzeri:</u> The County Shade Tree Division has begun tree trimming work; the tire disposal event was successful; Ground Penetrating Sonar work will begin at the cemetery in two to three weeks; the County has approved the installation of speed signs on Rochdale Avenue.

<u>Councilmember Ticktin:</u> Progress is being made with the vacant and abandoned properties in town; Mr. McGrath has been appointed as the Planning Board Secretary; the historic marker has been installed; discussed the need for a stop sign on the road coming out of the Assunpink WMA at the intersection of Rochdale Avenue, Tamara Drive and Clarksburg Road.

<u>Mayor Ellentuck:</u> The County's plan to repave Route 571 has been put on hold; the firehouse has sustained damage, the Engineer will inspect damage and an insurance claim will be submitted.

<u>Councilmember Bonna</u>: The Environmental Commission stream monitoring is underway; the Woodland Trail project work is scheduled to begin this week.

<u>Councilmember Malkin</u>: The budget is being tweaked; the Tax Collector would like to attend a Borough Council meeting to discuss software options for water/sewer billing; summer camp has begun and everything is going well.

<u>Councilmember Lipoti</u>: There was an open house at the water treatment plant on July 4th; provided an update on work at the sewer plant; discussed eliminating standing water to reduce mosquitos problems; acknowledged Ms. Tyers for work on the butterfly garden.

NEW BUSINESS

- Discussion of Cemetery Ordinance School Board: M/Ellentuck clarified that Board of Education members are not considered Elected Borough Officials in the Borough Ordinance.
