Dear Mayor and Council,

Pursuant to your request, below is our review of the conditions and demolition concerns for the above referenced site at 40 North Rochdale Avenue in Roosevelt Borough.

We have reviewed the two demolition contractor proposals; the remediation letter from T. Slack; the Wetlands Plan dated 10/21/04; the original NJDEP Letter of Interpretation (LOI) dated 9/26/05; and we had a telephone conversation with the LSRP who prepared the T. Slack Report.

We offer the following comments and concerns for the demolition of the building:

- It is unclear if hydraulic lifts are present in the building since it was not part of the Remediation
 Activities noted in the T. Slack Report. The LSRP mentioned they did not enter the building
 during their work because of the poor condition of the structure. With the exception of possible
 hydraulic lifts, the LSRP told us they have no concerns with the soil.
 - * If hydraulic lifts are present, additional studies and remediation activities can be anticipated.
- 2. The original NJDEP LOI dated 9/26/2005 expired in 2010. The expired LOI classified the wetlands shown as "exceptional resource value" with a standard transitional area buffer width of 150 feet. The 150-foot wide buffer on the offsite wetlands on Lot-5, encompass almost the entire building in question. The Borough needs to be concerned about this because disturbance to the soil and/or vegetation within this buffer would require additional NJDEP permits.
 - * The removal of the above ground structure, while not disturbing the slab, soil or vegetation within the buffer area is not regulated by the NJDEP and therefore would not require any permits. (NJAC 7:7A-2.6).
- 3. Both contractors propose to remove the building and slab from the site, and the original remediation allows for the soil disturbance and full slab removal. As described above, the Borough may wish to leave the slab in place to eliminate the need for this disturbance.
 - * This could have an effect on future development of the site. Leaving the slab in-place maximizes the "existing" impervious surface for possible future development. Any future development could utilize the same disturbance foot-print and only address the "increase" of impervious surface in any stormwater management plans. It may also make any future NJDEP Permits easier to obtain.

4. The removal of the slab would disturb approximately 4,000 square feet of soil, which is under the 5,000 square foot limit required for a Soil Conservation District (SCD) Permit.

* Although this would not require an SCD permit, removing the slab and disturbing the soil and vegetation would require a new LOI and an NJDEP Transitional Area Buffer Area Permit.

5. Neither contractor proposes to remove the asphalt paving on the site. If this is removed, it could result in a disturbance area of over 5,000 square feet.

* If the pavement is removed it would require an SCD Permit, a new LOI and an NJDEP Transitional Area Permit.

Recommendations:

If no hydraulic lifts are present, we recommend only the above ground portion of the Building be demolished and removed from the site but not the slab. Care should be taken to not disturb the surrounding soil and vegetation.

This eliminates the need for an NJDEP LOI Application, NJDEP Transitional Area Permits and any possibility of an SCD Permit. It also maximizes the existing impervious surface and disturbances for any future redevelopment of the site.

BOND ORDINANCE NO. 18-06 INTRODUCTION DATE: 07-23-18 ADOPTION DATE:

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE REPLACEMENT OF WATER MAINS, APPROPRIATING \$715,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$715,000 BONDS AND NOTES TO FINANCE A PORTION OF THE COSTS THEREOF, AUTHORIZED IN AND BY THE BOROUGH OF ROOSEVELT, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, NEW JERSEY

- BE IT ORDAINED by the BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF ROOSEVELT, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:
- Section 1. The improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby authorized as Water/Sewer Utility improvements to be undertaken in and by the Borough of Roosevelt, in the County of Monmouth, New Jersey (the "Borough"). For the improvements or purposes described in Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$715,000, said sum being inclusive of all appropriations heretofore made therefor. This bond ordinance authorizes projects intended to be funded through the New Jersey Infrastructure Bank Financing Program. Accordingly, no down payment is required or appropriated herein.
- Section 2. In order to finance the costs of said improvements or purposes not provided for by the application of the down payment, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount not to exceed \$715,000, pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvements or purposes, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.
- Section 3. (a) The improvements hereby authorized and the purposes for which the obligations are to be issued consist of the replacement of water mains located along various streets within the Borough, including Homestead Lane, Elm Court and Cedar Court, together with all purposes necessary, incidental or appurtenant thereto, all as shown on and in accordance with contracts, plans, specifications or requisitions therefor on file with or through the Borough Clerk, as finally approved by the governing body of the Borough.
- (b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for the improvements or purposes described in Section 3(a) hereof is \$715,000, as stated in Section 2 hereof.
- (c) The estimated cost of the improvements or purposes described in Section 3(a) hereof is \$715,000, which is equal to the amount of the appropriation herein made therefor.
- Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer of the Borough, provided that no note shall mature later than one (1) year from its date. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time

subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer, who shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of such notes occurs, such report shall include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

- Section 5. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:
- (a) The improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not a current expense and are improvements or purposes that the Borough may lawfully undertake as Water/Sewer Utility improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.
- (b) The average period of usefulness of the improvements or purposes, within the limitations of the Local Bond Law and taking into consideration the amount of the obligations authorized for said purposes, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is forty (40) years.
- (c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Municipal Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such Statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$715,000 and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by that Law.
- (d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$130,000 for interest on said obligations, costs of issuing said obligations, engineering costs, legal fees and other items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included as part of the cost of said improvements and is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for said improvements.
- (e) To the extent that moneys of the Borough are used to finance, on an interim basis, costs of said improvements or purposes, the Borough reasonably expects such costs to be paid or reimbursed with the proceeds of obligations issued pursuant hereto. This ordinance shall constitute a declaration of official intent for the purposes and within the meaning of Section 1.150-2(e) of the United States Treasury Regulations.
- Section 6. The capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget

and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

- Section 7. Any grant or similar moneys from time to time received by the Borough for the improvements or purposes described in Section 3 hereof, shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements within the appropriation herein authorized or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are received and so used.
- Section 8. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and, unless paid from other sources, the Borough shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Borough for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.
- Section 9. This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

ORDINANCE 18-07 INTRODUCTION DATE: 09-12-18 ADOPTION DATE:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF ROOSEVELT AMENDING CHAPTER 7: "VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC" OF THE BOROUGH CODE AT SECTION 7-14 TO CREATE A NEW STOP INTERSECTION AT HOMESTEAD LANE AND NORTH VALLEY ROAD

WHEREAS, the Borough of Roosevelt, County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey (the "Borough") operates and maintains certain public roadways within its municipal boundaries; and

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the Borough's attention that the intersection of the municipal roadways at Homestead Lane and North Valley Road should be made safer by creating a new stop intersection at said location;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Roosevelt, County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey, that Borough Code Chapter 7: "Vehicles and Traffic" shall be amended to supplement Section 7-14 therein as follows (stricken-text indicates deletions, underlined text indicates additions):

7-14 STOP INTERSECTIONS.

Pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 39:4-140, the intersections described are hereby designated as Stop Intersections. Stop signs shall be installed as provided therein. (New)

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this amending ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of their inconsistencies only; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this ordinance shall be in full force and take effect immediately upon final passage and publication.
