Polypropylene plastic containers – the kind used for yogurt and margarine, for example - can be identified by the #5 (PP) designation found on the container. Polypropylene containers are collected in numerous New Jersey recycling programs and may be added to more collection programs in the years ahead due to the strong recycling market for this material.
